The 1988 season is rapidly drawing to a close. NAHRA has enjoyed an increase in individual as well as club memberships. Fifty percent more field tests were held in 1988 as compared to 1987. Our growth and success this year can directly be attributed to our member clubs. Without the hard work of all who have given their time to promote the Hunting Retriever and the NAHRA concept, we could not survive. The spectrum is full and individuals diverse from bird throwers, gunners, marshals, handlers and judges to name a few. I have recently returned from Africa where I participated in the 1988 National Retriever Championship Stake. Although basic customs and procedures varied from what we are generally used to, the bottom line was the same. . .control. People make the difference and control the destiny of the Hunting Retriever. Without people NAHRA could not exist. Without you and your input we cannot progress. Get active and participate during the coming year; you are NAHRA and its future.

From Our Readers

Dear Editor:

I'm writing this letter because I'm concerned with the inconsistency of judging. I'm a new certified judge myself and I'm trying to develop my own judging patterns. I believe the idea of the judges' newsletter is a very good idea. This will keep the judges all over the country in touch with the different problems and situations that come up and to clarify NAHRA's rules on these different things. I myself am looking forward to going to some judging seminars, so I can build on my experiences and dog knowledge.

Some of the things I have seen and experienced have been a few of the judges seem to have forgotten what steps there are from senior down to intermediate and from intermediate

down to started. Using senior tests in intermediate is not the idea NAHRA had in mind. Or an intermediate mark in a started test. The tests set up as guided by the rule book are good strong tests. Problems encountered by dogs during tests should be looked at by the judges for the recovery and not just that the dog got into trouble. We are not looking for robots, but the natural hunting instinct of the retriever breeds.

One of the things I would like to see passed on to the other judges is the communication problem between judges and handlers. At a test, the better the communication, the better understanding the handlers have as to what is expected of them and their dogs. The tests would run smoother and faster.

Another thing is the use of the "MARGINAL SYSTEM." Informing the handlers that are called back if they are marginal indicates to the handlers that they did not meet the standards that the judges were looking for when setting up the test. This also helps the handlers to identify the certain area that they faltered in. I've been told that all handlers should know if they are marginal or not but this is not true. NAHRA is growing very fast here and we have to start helping these new people or we will turn them away from our concept. Clubs setting up a hunt-

ing test should take into consideration when selecting judges, how they communicate with handlers.

I also feel a judge should not have a quartering or trailing test as the last test. These two tests are the ones that are hard to put a point equivalent consistently from judge to judge.

The clubs themselves have to determine, especially when they plan a double event, that they have to limit the number of entries running under each set of judges. The judges should not eliminate the dogs in order to finish in one day, but give the dogs the chance to finish or eliminate themselves.

In respect to the certification of judges they should be or have already run dogs in NAHRA licensed tests within a time frame of receiving their certification. This should help them better understand the NAHRA concepts.

I myself plan on running my dogs and judge in different parts of the country so I can experience the different types of hunting and meet different people. I hope to meet both of you this coming year and maybe even get the chance to judge with you.

Thank you for your time and effort in the NAHRA concept, it's a good one.

Ask the Doctor

Q: I have a 2½-year old female Chesapeake that sheds alot of hair all year round. I've tried changing shampoos, foods, weekly brushings and keeping the fleas under control. What can I do to reduce the shedding?

A: Hair loss is influenced by a wide range of factors including nutrition, parasites, skin diseases, hormonal imbalances, environmental temperature, amount of sunlight, allergies and medications (including shampoos and flea products).

In general, if the skin appears healthy (no sores, flakes or itching), the haircoat is shiny and there are no thin or bald areas, I consider the shedding to be normal. It's important to remember that the dog will replace each hair every year. Dogs brought inside in the evenings will continuously shed year around due to the increased heat and light they are exposed to in our houses. Dogs kept strictly outside tend to have mainly seasonal shedding.

Hormonal imbalances can be manifested by thinly haired areas which are not itchy.

Itchy skin, resulting in hair loss via chewing and scratching can have many causes and is best handled by your vet. Among the more common causes are infections, parasites, allergies and seborrhea. In addition, excessive grooming and some flea products can dry the skin leading to itchiness, so review with your vet your feeding, parasite control and grooming programs.

Q: Recently you wrote about the inheritance of hip dysplasia. Would you cover the treatment of dysplasia?

A: Treatment of hip dysplasia, which is a progressive arthritis of the hip joint, includes both medical and surgical options. In addition, it is of paramount importance to maintain optimal weight control as well as a consistant, moderate exercise program within the bounds of what the dog can comfortably tolerate.

Medically, most therapy is aimed at relieving the inflammation associated with the arthritis. Commonly used products range from aspirin and Tylenol (*not Advil*) to phenylbutazone and cortisone-like products. Other medical programs utilize Adequan or vitamin regimens, though I've not tried them enough to attest to their efficacy.

Surgically, the options include total hip replacement, pelvis rotation, removal of the femoral head, and a muscle/nerve cutting procedure.

Selection of a medical or surgical option is dependent on age, severity of pain, weight, cost, surgical expertise, and the desired function of the animal post-surgically. Your vet can assist you in deciding which option is best for your dog.





Wolters Says . . .

Every once in awhile we should take a look at what we are doing to be sure we are staying with the original plan that we of NAHRA set out to do.

Over a few years time we are all seeing entrance fees to our events climb like the stock market before October of last year. I'm not expecting us to crash down as it did but it's time to re-look at what we are doing.

This coming weekend I will be going to a double senior event and the tab for the entrance fee will be a fat \$90.00. I remember when that was two week's salary. I will run Tar for the next three weekends and the fourth won't cost me because I will judge. I hope my wife does not read this because four weekends like this one coming up would break the bank.

Here is what I think the coming weekend will cost. I will drive 1,700 miles. At 20 miles a gallon I will spend \$87.55 for gas. Three nights in the motel will be \$120.00. Food for that time will have to run no less than \$25.00 a day. At four days that will be \$100.00. If my wife goes with me you can double that figure. On this particular event the premium stated that late entrance fee would cost \$20.00 a dog. (I was away on business and I will be late.) They advanced the closing date by a full week, against NAHRA rules. The premium stated there would be a charge for the tailgate and dinner on Saturday night. No amount was listed in the premium but let's say \$10.00. . . \$20.00 with wife. Oh yes, the club announced that they would charge \$5.00 for a scratch. If I do not scratch it will cost me \$557.55 for the weekend. . . add it up. . . over 500 bucks.

Well, it won't quite cost that because I called the president of the club and point-

ed out that they were closing two weeks before the event and they should not change NAHRA rules. They decided to not have a late fee or a scratch fee. That saved me \$40.00.

They expect over 50 dogs in the senior event alone. As a double event that will be an income of about \$9,500 without counting Intermediate or Started entrance fees. They plan an auction after the dinner that in years past brought in \$2,000.00 for the club. I told them they should go into the banking business.

One of the things that really got to me was charging for the tailgate affair. That is the fun of these events. The pressure of the day is off and people like to sit around and talk dogs, women or some other fine subject. A lot of friends have been made through NAHRA and this is the time to enjoy the friendships. I believe that now the club decided not to charge for the tailgate affair. . . that saves me \$20.00. The weekend tally is only an even \$500.00.

Let me point out that we started NAHRA for two main reasons. The first and most important was to develop a gene pool of working, hunting retrievers. The other was to give the little guy, the hunter a place in this sport. He could not afford the licensed field trial game so we came up with NAHRA. . . a game he could afford. . . I thought.

Well, at these prices the hunter, that little guy will be forced out of our game too. The above example of the weekend is **MORE EXPENSIVE THAN LAST WEEK'S**

AKC LICENSED FIELD TRIAL IN VIRGINIA!

Last year one club charged \$65.00 for their senior event. We of NAHRA sat by and said nothing. We knew they would get so few dogs at that price that they would learn their own lesson. They did. It must have cost the club a bunch of money for their last minute phone bill. . . calling around to try to get people to come.

The NAHRA board has tried to stay out of club business but now I see that we are going to have to keep a close eye on what is happening so that if need be clubs don't run wild.

We know that birds are expensive. . . we know that bird boys are expensive. . . We know that all costs have gone up but \$45.00 Senior, \$40.00 Intermediate and \$35.00 Started is excessive.

Let me end on a Happy note. Bill Ferguson's dog, Happy, a Chesapeake Bay Retriever, is the first and only dog in the United States to have achieved the Master Hunting Retriever title, or its equivalent in the AKC, UKC, and NAHRA testing programs. Bill ran Happy in our first Invitational. The dog did a fantastic job until the last bird when he broke. Everyone thought Happy had done the best job of all the dogs up until that point. It was a heart breaker. The dog was trained by Gerald Hopkins and this year Bach Doar took Happy on the licensed field trial circuit where Bach says he did a great job.

I asked Gerald, who ran Happy in all the hunting tests, how he would rate the three organizations. After a long discussion of describing what each group did he rated AKC as being nowhere as good as UKC or NAHRA. He could not rate UKC or NAHRA against each other because it was like comparing apples and oranges and both pieces of fruit were good.

Trainer's Notebook

'The Check Cord'



Most new handlers have difficulty controlling their dog and giving them directional lines to the bird. A six foot length of 1/4 inch nylon cord may be the most useful and inexpensive training device you will ever have.

Attach one end of the cord to your belt on whichever side your dog sits at heel. Run the other end of the cord through your dog's collar, (Fig 1) then around your back and into your hand on the opposite side (Fig 2). You will then be able to control your dog at your side and give him a directional line with the proper hand. (Fig 3). The dog can then be released on command to make the retrieve by releasing the cord from your hand and allowing the cord to slip through the collar as he leaves for the retrieve. (Fig 4) The dog pictured above heels on the right side. Simply reverse the procedure if your dog heels on the left.

On August 21, 1988, Lake View Magic Marker (19 wks old) and Lakeview Niki (26 wks old), two black lab female pups, owned and handled by Mn. Hunting Retriever Assn. member Rob Willis of Willmar, Mn., became the youngest retrievers in the history of the NAHRA program to achieve their started Retriever Certificates. Both pups qualified twice at a licensed NAHRA event held August 20 & 21, 1988 near Lundar, Manitoba, Canada. Sponsored by the Manitoba Gun Dog Assn.

Rob purchased Magic from Crow River Kennels of Belgrade, Mn. and Niki from Fischer's Kennels of Albany, Mn. Magic's parents are MHR Hiwood Pacers Mr. Tanner X MHR WR Mississippi Brandy and Niki's parents are MHR WR Mississippi Rascal X Fischer's Flying Target, respectively. All four parents are involved in the NAHRA program with Brandy, Rascal, and Tanner all participating in the 1988 Alpo-NAHRA Invitational.

From the time Magic & Niki were brought home at the age of seven weeks, Rob followed a training program from Richard Wolter's book *Game Dog*. Double Events:

Twice The Bang For The Buck Or Double Trouble?

The style of organization of NAHRA tests have evolved in this region. A while back one team of judges would do both Intermediate and Senior, sometimes varying tests back and forth between the stakes and often taking two days. That organization has faded out, partly with the growing size of entries. (I never liked it.)

This year double events are the norm. Usually this means a Saturday event and another Sunday event. Often both Senior and Intermediate are organized this way. A few clubs have been fortunate to draw fairly big entries such doubles and come away with their debts paid and even a little money in the bank. The advantage to a handler traveling a long distance is clear - you get two chances at points for one trip cost. This helps draw from longer distances. In these financial ways, double events ARE twice the bang for the buck. But they have a cost that we should discuss as judges and handlers.

A couple of years ago Gary Erickson and Mark Miller put on one of the most picturesque senior tests I have ever seen. The handler rowed his dog out to a point set up for duck hunting. There was a triple and a blind to a trail. Then the handler and dog rowed back. Another time Clarke Campbell and Rick Knuth had a dove hunt intermediate test where you sat a few minutes telling a hunting story "waiting for the birds to come in." I'm not seeing these extra "hunting touches" at the double events. Twenty-some senior dogs running in one day leaves little room for rowing boats and the like. The tests I've seen have been mostly good, but fairly plain.

My first questions are: Do we want to sacrifice giving tests a real hunting look in order to do one-day events? If not, what is the limit on the entry for a one-day Senior or Intermediate? One of the best senior tests I've seen was a one-day test with 10 entries. Does it have to be that small? Two-day double events with two sets of judges are the

best solution for judges and handlers, but they're double trouble and expensive for the clubs. Even the number of workers required becomes a problem for small clubs. What does it take for a club to go this route and still make money?

If everything goes well, you can run twenty-some dogs thru good, if plain, senior tests in a day. A long and tiring day to be sure. The extra pressure I don't like about these tests is the sort of thing that happens when something goes a little wrong. For example, clubs have no idea when they sign 25 senior dogs up that there will be a violent hail storm with lightening and threat of tornado taking an hour out of the afternoon. Or they don't know that there will be a 30 mph wind from an unfavorable direction for the site. High wind can really louse up test plans in my experience. Judges, including me, who find themselves in such situations are forced to cut corners. You might score a test leniently that you would rather re-set, but can't because of the time. You might put some tough stuff first to "thin the pack," though this practice is forbidden for its own sake in NAHRA. The pressure is there even if you don't want to do it. You might not want to "look at that dog again," because he's on the edge of failing and PROBABLY won't make it. Maybe you subtract one more point to justify your feeling. You might settle for a single dragged trail rather than fresh ones for each dog or use a very short quarter.

My mind isn't made up on these events. My second question for fellow judges is: What's your experience with these kinds of events and what's your conclusion? Are you forced to cut serious corners or only round off some edges? Are we better off with 'em or without 'em? If we can afford it, next spring I'll ask our club to run two two-day seniors. Of course, if we get a small entry the extra judges will put us in debt. . . I don't know "the" answer.

'Training Tips'

Hunting & Training

Hunting season is finally here and it's time to put our dogs to the test under real conditions. We will soon see if all of the training and NAHRA simulation pays off. However, as the hunting season progresses, all of the hard work we have done with our dog will progressively deteriorate. I am sure that many of you are asking yourselves how this could possibly happen, especially those that are new to the sport.

It happens because we concern ourselves more with bagging game than with our dog's behavior. Each time we enter the field the dog learns that it can get away with more and more. Slipped whistles and/or command refusals become more frequent as the dog learns that we are more interested in the hunt and B.Sing with our hunting buddies than with his/her performance.

Just because it's the real thing, there is absolutely no reason to slack off on the demands you normally make of your dog. You must continue to expect the very best out of your dog and be willing to settle for nothing less.

Part of the problem is lack of attentiveness from our dogs. Birds are found and retrieves are made rather quickly in our training and field tests. Our dogs are not conditioned to go long periods of time without finding a bird or making a retrieve. Nothing is more frustrating for a good hunting dog than not being able to produce, and your dog will soon lose interest and give up if success isn't part of the program.

To remedy this situation, I recommend that you carry along a training bumper or dead pigeon in your game vest on all of your hunting expeditions. When hunting is slow, you will be ready to keep your dog attentive with a little training.

If your dog is unproductive for more than an hour when hunting upland game, drop the bird or bumper into the cover

and bring your dog back around into the wind so that he/she can have success after searching for such a long time without being productive.

The same goes for duck and goose hunting. Take a bumper or bird into the blind with you. During the slack times of the hunt, which on occasion can be all day, make use of the situation by throwing marks or running blinds out through your rig. When the birds finally do arrive, your dog will be even more ready and enjoy greater success because of the extra training.

You must always expect your dog to challenge your authority whether you are training or hunting. Because of the more relaxed nature of the real hunting situation, you must sometimes force yourself to be as demanding of your dog as you are in your training sessions.

I know you can't always stop everything in the middle of a hot hunting situation just to correct your dog. However, after the shooting has subsided and things settle back down, set the same situation up and make your dog respond in the manner in which you have trained him/her.

If you approach hunting with this in mind, any problems that may arise will be minor and you and your dog will have a successful season. You will also have far fewer bad habits to straighten out come spring.

From The North Country

Andy Loranger



Most of us are by now aware of the severe impacts that drought conditions in the prairie states and provinces are having on continental waterfowl populations. Recent figures released by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service indicate that pintails dipped to record low numbers for the second consecutive year in 1988, and blue-winged teal and mallard populations are near record lows. Not since the Dust Bowl of the 1930's have prairie habitats been so devastated. The challenges facing all concerned with our waterfowl resources are real and most definitely imposing.

The battle to halt these declines and bring about recovery is being fought on many fronts. National, state and provincial wildlife agencies, conservation and sportsmen's organizations and private individuals are all taking on vital roles, and necessarily so. International agreements such as the recently signed North American Waterfowl Management Plan have set concrete longterm goals, and if implemented, offer real hope for the future.

It is with a genuine concern for all wildlife resources that two Alaskan organizations recently sponsored a NAHRA Field Test. The Eagle River, Alaska Chapter of Ducks Unlimited joined the Wildlife Federation of Alaska, a state affiliate of the National Wildlife Federation and second-time field test sponsor, in an effort to emphasize an often unspoken goal of the NAHRA program - to promote the use of trained retrievers as a conservation tool. In this time of crisis for many waterfowl populations, it is a goal worth examining and certainly of proclaiming a little bit louder.

Without question, our retrievers recover birds that would otherwise be lost on almost every hunt. Studies have shown that trained retrievers can reduce crippling loss to a fraction of what it is for those hunting without a dog. Additionally, retrievers often recover cripples lost by other hunters. Through the NAHRA program, thousands of retriever owners across North America are improving their dogs' hunting skills while working towards the "finished prod-

uct." What this all translates into is a significant contribution towards preserving the resource. The results thus far are well worth being proud of. Also well documented are the immense contributions of groups such as Ducks Unlimited and the National Wildlife Federation and their local affiliates in preserving our wildlife heritage. NAHRA's numerous and still growing number of associations with such organizations help demonstrate the benefits of using trained retrievers and in fact promote their use, as well as directly involving our organization and its members in efforts to preserve and improve wildlife habitats and benefit the fish and wildlife populations that utilize them.

The stage is set - last series. A shot is fired and handler and dog approach the point of origin. The first task is a blind retrieve approximately 80 yards away through running water, two grassy islands and finally swimming water across a deep channel. On the way to the blind, a flyer is shot off to the right, too tempting for your hunting companions to pass up. A decision to make - keep handling to the blind or pick up the flyer. If you choose the latter, two incoming birds are taken on the left immediately upon delivery. Pick up this over and under and the blind awaits you, more difficult than before. The eager Lab launches on a good line to the blind and stops crisply when the flyer is shot. He wants that bird, is leaning that way. The handler waits him out, the dog is now remembering the original line. He takes a strong left hand back and two-whistles the blind from there. His marks are excellent - a great job and another Senior qualifying score. The hunting retriever who cut his teeth in a NAHRA Started event two years ago is now acing Senior work and preparing for his third full hunting season, a fine companion, the finished product. Very importantly, he, his owner and their organization, the North American Hunting Retriever Association, are also helping to perpetuate the grand sport of waterfowling.


After lunch and a bit of respite from the downpour Sharon and Greg set up the very interesting and challenging Interme-

Navesink River Hunting Retriever Club, Inc.

In late September 1984, a small group of handlers at the annual Shrewsbury Retriever Club Gun Dog Trial started to talk about the need for more gun dog trials and training sessions in New Jersey. Dave and I had been traveling to Vermont, several times a year since 1978, for the Lake Champlain Retriever Club's training sessions, Gun Dog Trials and early NAHRA Sanctioned Field Tests. We all agreed that this was the type of club we needed in the New Jersey area.

Shortly after, a meeting followed at Dr. Jim Dubel's home in Barnegate Bay, N.J. Everyone was very excited, but not until October 27, 1985, did the official ground work start for the Navesink River Hunting Retriever Club (NRHRC). At this meeting club officers were chosen, club constitution and by-laws were set up and we all enjoyed, in total amazement, the NAHRA video tape "Two Days on the James River." We knew we had a lot of hard work ahead of us.

One tremendous promotion the NRHRC puts on each year is at the annual Hunting and Fishing Expo at the Asbury Park Convention Center in Asbury Park, N.J. Here the club sets up a booth with NRHRC and NAHRA membership applications and information. Club members are there to answer questions and put on retriever training demonstrations. Dr. Jim Dubel has co-ordinated, supervised and worked this show each year and generated tremendous enthusiasm and income from new memberships and raffles.

Our next step was to hold training sessions, we had two in 1986, which enabled the club to purchase additional insurance to use live ammunition at our training sessions and tests. By April 26, 1987, we had our first training sessions with live birds and on May 17, 1987, our first club field test with 34 entries. Another field test and more training sessions followed. Jack Jagoda gave a great NAHRA training session in September 1987. At the training session he explained and demonstrated the NAHRA standard and training procedures for each, started, intermediate, and senior category. Everyone was very pleased with all they learned at this session.

On May 21-22, 1988, NRHRC entered the ranks of clubs approved to hold Licensed Hunting Retriever Tests. It was agreed to have beginner, started and intermediate tests only. After setting up a Field Test Committee and workers amounting to 30-plus people our first Licensed NAHRA Field Test came and went without a hitch. Club members donated all their own equipment, boats, blinds, decoys, you name it. I must take the time

here to thank our judges Lindy and Seth Hochberg, who judged puppy/beginner, Gaylord Hoisington and Sean Kilbride, who judged intermediate and no one will forget Mary Grace La Pierre Kennedy and Peter Kennedy who judged started. It seems a lot of handlers were worried about the last started test. Handler and dog had to get into a Barnegate Bay Sneak Box, be rowed out to a designated spot in the cove, the handler then had to throw or place a decoy into the water which started the test. The dog then had to retrieve the duck, which was thrown by a bird boy, and return to the boat. Well, only two of the remaining 22 dogs were dropped on this test and no one fell out of the boat. With the exception of our new Club President Dave Tassey, who jumped over board to calm our dog Kelly, who fell off the back side of the boat deck. Mary Grace told Dave "If he retrieved the duck in his mouth they would give him a ribbon." Dave did not take them up on that one; but Kelly did go out and retrieve the duck. We thank the judges for their patience in giving dogs the opportunity to complete the tests even though they failed. I'm sorry I did not get to see the intermediate tests but from what I heard they did a super job setting up real hunting scenarios and were very helpful to all handlers.

It may be considered a small licensed test with only eight beginners, 27 started, 26 intermediate dogs entered and no senior test, but it was a pleasure to have it come off so well and have handlers tell us they would like to come back to New Jersey for another event.

The long road from September 1984 to May 1988 was worth it. The NRHRC put one foot in front of the other and got the job done. Now 46 members strong, we have succeeded in organizing the first dog club in New Jersey for the purpose of training and field testing hunting retrievers. Dave and I send our personal thanks to Ned Spear for his support in the past, John Krupp for selling us our first labrador and talking us into training her for hunting and to Dr. Jim Dubel for his endless enthusiasm and energy to get NRHRC off the ground. Also, thanks go out to Jack Jagoda for his current support as the NHARA's new president.

If you are thinking of starting a new retriever club, stop thinking and start talking to other retriever owners. Put one foot in front of the other and you can do it too!

Flint is a very versatile hunting dog. He has qualified in 6 out of 7 NAHRA stakes earning his WR title. (The only English Springer ever to earn a WR title.) He also excels in the Hunting Spaniel Tests, scoring 99 out of 100 points in his last test. He does well in traditional field trials for Springers and qualified in the Wisconsin Open Pheasant Championship in 1988.

From retrieving geese on the Horicon Marsh in the dawn of the morning to flushing pheasants in the midafternoon he has proven to be one of the most versatile competitive hunting dogs.

"WING TIPS"

Waders and hip boots should be hung with the feet up. This will allow them to properly shed any moisture that may have developed on the inside and they will dry properly. This will ensure the longevity of the boots. Make sure the boots are hung out of the sunlight as ultraviolet rays can really damage the rubber.

Freezing water in plastic milk jugs to place in your cooler will serve more than one purpose. As the ice melts, you will have a container of cold drinking water for yourself or your dog. Make sure you freeze with the cap off of the jug and it is only 2/3 full of water or it will explode.



And Life Goes On. . .

I don't really want to remember Charcoal the way I saw her last. Twelve years old, her once sturdy body gaunt from lack of nourishment, her strength gone but her eyes still clear and filled with trust and affection. It was a favor by veterinarian Bruce Pierce to make a special Sunday evening trip to his clinic and mercifully put the old black Labrador to sleep.

I didn't think she would make it through Saturday night, but Sunday morning she was able to rise of her own accord and totter outside as she had done for all these years. Exhausted, she lay down on the driveway. I helped her up and she came into the back hallway to lie down again. She stayed there until the afternoon when she somehow found the strength to walk into the

living room where I was working. She always wanted to be close by. She never moved from that spot until we made the call and the trip to the clinic.

Good dogs are more than pets; they're even more than friends and companions. They become a part of you and when they die it's almost like a removal of one of your members. Anyone who has had the privilege of sharing part of his or her life with a good dog knows the feeling. Anyone who hasn't probably shouldn't try to understand.

Charcoal was a good dog. From the day she arrived as a squirming armful of puppy fur and wet tongue through a summer of training sessions and many happy seasons of bird hunting, she devoted her life to pleasing me and doing what was expected of her. To eat, to sleep, to retrieve, to be included in the family circle was all she asked. In return she provided effort and abilities that will live long in my memory.

Those are the things I will remember. . .

. . .The opening morning of her first hunting season as a 10-month-old pup when she retrieved nine ducks in 15 minutes for me and my hunting partners at a favorite pothole;

. . .The first time she came back with a ruffed grouse that I would have sworn I missed as it disappeared in heavy cover;

. . .Her struggle through muck and mire to retrieve her first goose—a high flying snow that was also the first goose for my son who had just reached his teens;

. . .The South Dakota snow storm when we hunted the slough behind Gordy's barn, shot three rooster pheasants and Char retrieved five;

. . .How quiet she was on a pre-dawn drive to the duck marsh—and how well-chewed the floor shift know was when we got there;

. . .How she and her canine companions quickly taught native South Dakotans that pheasants shot over cattail marshes were fair game and seldom lost;

. . .How many times she disregarded my directions and came back with a crippled bird;

. . .Her chin in my lap as I drove home after a tiring day in the field or marsh;

. . .How her experience accumulated over the years and she earned the nickname of "The Bounty Hunter" for her persistence and success in tracking, flushing and retrieving cagey rooster pheasants;

. . .That she wouldn't let the furnace repairman in the house, but if he let her out with him when he went to his truck, she willingly came back in the house with him;

. . .How she patiently accepted the pup she came to live with her last fall and who I hope will create many new memories;

. . .Her remarkable recovery from tendon surgery which gave her the last half of her lifetime to hunt;

. . .How our minds meshed in the last few years and we could anticipate and understand each other's actions while hunting, rarely needing a spoken word to communicate;

. . .All of these and hundreds of other memories are tucked away in the folds of my brain, awaiting recall if I ever have time to sit down and drag them out to laugh about or wonder at.

"WING TIPS"

Puppy bumpers can be easily made using empty reloading shot bags. Four dummies can be made from one shot bag. Simply unravel the seam and then cut the bag into fourths. Take each piece and sew along one end and down the side leaving the other end open. Turn the bag right side out and stuff with cork, packing foam worms or any other suitable material. Sew the remaining end shut and you have a small inexpensive bumper for pup.



"WING TIPS"

Geese change their feeding locations frequently. To avoid digging a new pit everytime they move, try just wearing camouflaged clothing and laying down amongst the decoys. Use a camo space blanket to keep the cold damp ground away from your body.

A plastic or metal basket used to hold milk jugs makes a great equipment carrier. It makes it easier to keep things organized and they can be easily removed from your vehicle.

Using automobile polish on your favorite hunting guns can help to ensure the lack of rust build up on the metal at the end of the season.

When shooting at larger birds such as geese, ducks or pheasants, try concentrating on key areas as targets. The white ring around a cock bird's neck. The eye or beak of a duck or goose. This will help to take your eye off of the body and wings and to concentrate on the vital areas.


