





Heat Stroke by Dave Sobel, DVM

With the excessive heat and humidity of this past summer and fall I have received several questions regarding the recognition and emergency treatment of heat stroke in dogs. On days when the temperature is above 90 and the dew point suggests high humidity, dogs working in the field are at risk for some heat injury.

Heat stroke is a series of injuries resulting from body temperature generally above 106 for any length of time. These excessive temperatures result in depletion of tissue oxygen stores, resulting in rapid cell damage and cell death. These injuries include ulceration of intestinal lining, degeneration of muscle tissue, kidney failure, and, most severely, damage to blood cells. This damage to circulating blood cells can lead to severe alterations in the body's ability to clot blood properly, leading to death.

Recognition of the impending problem is due to owner's management of the disease. On hot days, it is wise to keep a rectal thermometer in your canine first aid kit (an inexpensive digital one works great). While many hot dogs will initially show excessive panting, the dog with heat stroke may not necessarily pant excessively. The dog's body may have already lost the ability to use panting as a heat dissipating mechanism. More commonly these dogs will collapse, salivate excessively, have a temperature of 106 or above, and have dark brown to brick red mucous membranes on their gums. Vomiting and diarrhea are also common.

Initial emergency treatment in the field should include immersing the dog or spraying the dog with COLD (NOT ICE OR FREEZING) water. Ice water can make the dog shiver and generate more heat. Immediate transport to a veterinary hospital is needed for further aggressive diagnostics and treatment. Travel with the windows down in the car.

Prevention of heat stroke is certainly easier than treatment. Avoiding work on hot sunny days is the best prevention. Working or hunting in areas where natural water is available is helpful. Frequent

breaks, in the shade, with the offer of fresh water to drink is recommended. If there is any question in your mind as to whether or not your dog is beginning to get overheated, STOP -- call it a day!

"Summer Itch" by Phyllis Giroux, DVM

It's summer, and some (or all) of you have itchy dogs. Let's talk about some of the reasons that dogs scratch.

Possibly the most common, and definitely the most obvious, reason is fleas. Fleas hop on your dog and bite, feeding on blood and fluid, then hop off to molt to another lifestage or to lay eggs.

How do you eliminate fleas? Wash your dog in flea shampoo and, if you're so inclined, follow with a flea dip. Dips are usually a higher concentration of insecticide, and are supposed to have a longer effect than a plain shampoo. What shampoo is best? Get a quality shampoo with a flea killing ingredient. I really think that

the products available from your veterinarian are worth the extra money, because the shampoo base itself is better quality, with appropriate pH and conditioners, and is sually more concentrated. I usually dilute a good brand of flea shampoo with 2-3 times the volume of water. I get as good a flea kill and it's easier to rinse clean. Pyrethrin may cause an allergic type reaction in a dog (or owner) with pre-existing sensitivities. We have killed the fleas but may have given the dog a new reason to scratch. One solution is to use a product with a synthetic pyrethrin-permethrin, allethrin, transrethrin, resmethrin, etc. These products are chemically pure because they are manufactured in a laboratory and less likely to stimulate allergic reactions.Other alternatives are to use a shampoo with d-limonene, which is a citrus extract that kills fleas but has no toxicity, or use a product with a carbamate (you may recognize the brand name Sevin).

You must remember that if your dog has fleas, some fleas are living wherever the dog has been--your home, your yard, your car, or his dog house. The fleas in those places must be killed by sprays or foggers, or they will jump on your dog as soon as he/she re-enters those areas. The premise treatments with the growth regulators, which prevent immature fleas from maturing into adults, are well worth the additional expense in savings of time and effort.

There are a couple of internal flea products on the market. Proban, which has been available for years, is an insecticide that is taken internally, becomes incorporated into your dog's system, and poisons the fleas that feed on you dog. It's a product that apparently is very safe, but you cannot use certain flea control products on your dog if he/she is taking Proban, and frankly, I just can't get comfortable with the whole idea.. There is a brand new product out this year called Program. The active ingredient here is a developmental inhibitor that affects a part of the life cycle of the flea, but has no known toxicity to mammals. Your dog takes this medication once a month (OK to take at same time as heartworm preventative), and when female fleas feed on a dog using Program, their eggs won't hatch. It won't kill the fleas, but it will interrupt their life cycle, and prevent a resident flea population in your home. It is not an insecticide, and you may use any other flea products you choose to bathe, dip, or spray

you dog, treat your home and yard as needed. This is a very exciting new product and I am very anxious to see how effective it will be.

One brief word about a biological flea control product marketed as Interrupt, Bioflea. This product contains a tiny worm called a nematode that actually feeds on flea larvae. If you have a resident flea population in your yard, you may use this product to get it under control. Two important factors in using this approach are that there must be adequate flea larvae present in the soil to provide a food source for these nematodes, or they will simply die of starvation. The second is that these are susceptible to other sprays you may want to use to spray your doghouses and runs for fleas or ticks, so that should not be done in areas these nematodes have been applied. These destroy the flea larvae by using them as food, thereby preventing them from maturing and reproducing. Remember, once the flea larvae are gone, the nematodes will no longer have a food supply, and they themselves will die. This is a very safe way to control fleas, using a natural approach to pest control.

The other main reason that dogs scratch is because they have allergies. A dog can be allergic to fleas, ingredients in the food, environmental factors such as dust, mold, or pollen that are inhaled, or environmental factors that contact his/her skin. Dogs that are allergic to fleas don't just have the itch from the flea bite, they have a major histamine release from the bite that can become generalized similar to the reaction a person who is allergic to beestings will have. Most veterinarians can do a simple test in the office to evaluate a dog that is allergic to fleas, or may be able to deduce from your dog's symptoms and history that this is the problem.

If your dog is itchy, has runny eyes or nose, and chews or licks at his/her feet during certain periods of the year, your dog is probably allergic to something in the environment. If the allergies persist year round, and your dog spends a lot of time rubbing at his/her eyes and muzzle, the diet may be the cause. Many times it will take repeated consultations with your veterinarian to identify the pattern of an allergy. Some dogs are so severely affected they may require a visit to a veterinary dermatologist to identify the offending agent(s) and attempt to control the symptoms. If the cause of the allergy is something that can be eliminated from the dog's life, that is


the best solution. Most times, however, the dog is allergic to grass, or house dust, or mold--items that a dog, especially a hunting dog, will be exposed to by his very nature. Then, we try to limit exposure if possible, and control the symptoms by frequent bathing (to remove the offending particles from the haircoat), and medications such as antihistamines and corticosteroids. Many dogs with allergies develop inflammation and secondary bacterial infection of their skin, and need to be treated with antibiotics as well. These problems can be controlled with appropriate treatment, but seldom cured.

There are a few other conditions that make dogs itchy such as sarcoptic mange, certain tumors, some hormonal disorders, and parasites. These are much less common and we are not going to take the time to discuss them in this article.

The last point I have to make about itchy dogs is that many dogs scratch out of habit, or boredom. Remember that behavioral control can be very effective in reducing the frequency that dogs scratch.

We all know how hard it is to get a good night's rest with one, two, or three scratching retrievers on the bed!





These outstanding places all have something in common besides being the sights of NAHRA National Invitationals. They all have superb varieties of water, cover and terrain.

These places haven't just been "showcases" for the finest hunting retrievers in North America but "showplaces" for some of the finest wildlife habitat anywhere.

I have been very fortunate to be able to travel all over North America to judge and run dogs in NAHRA events. Every club's grounds I have visited has been a virtual paradise for wildlife. You can't beat that kind of environment for running and judging hunting retrievers.

For many NAHRA members, this kind of environment only exists at the expense of a lengthy drive. To be honest, the wonderful Master Hunting Retrievers that have traveled to the past Invitationals have spent the majority of their lives practicing their routines and disciplines in less likely "fields of dreams" such as backyards, schoolyards, parks, neighborhood vacant lots and empty parking lots. Even front rooms, kitchens, basements, garages and barns are excellent areas for dog training.

Al Roggow from Anchorage, Alaska had a chubby little female Labrador that he called Annie Bug. She was one of the easiest handling dogs on blind retrieves that I have ever seen. Al said he owed it all to long winters, deep snow and nothing better to do than to hide treats all around the house and handle Annie to the stashes when she was just a pup. He played that game with her for her entire life. I've never seen a dog take "Overs" and "Backs" with such enthusiasm.

There is nothing better than a long hallway to teach a very young pup to retrieve and bring the object right back to you. (Be sure to close the doors to the bedrooms and bathroom or "Pup" will take every detour possible.) There is no chasing them around as they can't get by you in a narrow hallway.

At night during the winter months, Greg and Sharon Perry extended their young Labrador "Sadie" on marks in the empty, plowed and lighted college parking lots of Eastern Washington University. As Sadie got older, they did their initial handling drills on these asphalt fields as well.

A child's swimming pool in the backyard is a great way to introduce puppies to water if you don't have ready access to lakes or rivers with gradual shores.

Backyards and school playgrounds are terrific for teaching young dogs about extending on marks, taking lines to blinds, beginning handling drills as well as the mechanics of running multiple marks.

Obedience drills can be and should be done everywhere. In the house, in the yard and in the field. Spend some quality bonding time with obedience work by taking your dog for walks (on leash) in different neighborhoods to acclimate your dog to noise and distractions.

I happen to live just 5 miles from the Spokane Polo Grounds. What a fantastic flat grassy area to run young dogs. Extending, marking drills, handling drills and initial multiple marks can be taught

with the greatest of ease without the confusion of rolling terrain and cover influences.

Once the dog understands the mechanics of what's expected, then you go to the vacant lots and fields to incorporate the challenges of terrain and cover.

These less likely training areas can be some of the most important training areas in order to get to the NAHRA Invitational "Fields of Dreams".



stands the problems and is poised for action I'll let you know how that's working in a few months after we've had time to make progress.

I don't know if they let ghosts out anymore or if you can use a word processor, but I could really use your writing skill to attack some problems related to your old nemesis. Mary Nelson did a pretty good RAW-type expose two issues ago in Gun Dog magazine pointing out how extreme tests in the AKC Hunt Test program are encouraging folks to use brutal training methods. She is seeing young retrievers run with more fear than style and rightfully asked "Why are we doing this to our hunting partners?" It reminded me of your articles in Gun Dog 15 years ago. Robert McKowan of the AKC received space in Gun Dog this issue to reply. His reply is full of half-truths like claiming that 226 dogs in the "national" shows that their "standard" is working. He fails to mention that only 35 dogs finished. Some "standard." If I had your skill, perhaps I could respond, but I don't care if they wreck their program. I need your help "inhouse."

How should I explain to NAHRA judges that they should not imitate other people's mistakes or bring their mental baggage from other games? NAHRA judging is largely good; a decade of progress really is significant. However, we're beginning to see a trend of "cross over" judging from folks who play the other games. Extreme or trick tests popular in those tests creep in too often in NAHRA: fake extreme honors, blinds wildly beyond the demands of hunting, trivial upland or trailing tests. We're seeing too much emphasis on handling; handle on the marks, handle in the upland test, then REALLY handle on the blinds. If you could teach me your writing style, I could get folks stirred up and angry enough to do something constructive. All I can say to NAHRA judges is: Keep it real and let the handler run their own dogs like real hunting dogs. We don't need to have every Senior test hinge on a water blind of exactly 100 yards over a scented point 80 yards out. In NAHRA, any one of the tests could be the day's tough one. We won't tolerate stretching the distances just because other games do it. The trouble is, I'm afraid that's just too polite. I wish I could ZING 'em like you used to. It would help us stay in the lead.

You should know that your last retriever down here, Duck, is still doing fine. I saw him recently at a test near Atlanta. Olive sent him down with Charles Jurney so we could all enjoy the work. Duck's younger brother, Max, owned by Larry Richards, is following in his father's footsteps. as well. He runs with the same pizazz and joy. Many fine retrievers are left for us hunters to build their future, but those same old forces of destruction are still here, too. We have only scratched the surface of the group of hunters, I hope the clubs will help us expand. We could use you here stirring things up, but we'll manage. The dogs are worth it.

Please say hello to Arch Letta, who recently joined you up there. The whole NAHRA family misses you both.

Game Dog; The Video

The late Richard A. Wolters left a number of legacies to the world of hunting retrievers. There is the hunt test movement, numbering thousands of participants. There are better dogs being bred because Dick Wolters worried so passionately that the Labrador was being puppy milled into snappish incompetence. There is his massive masterwork about the history of the Lab. But perhaps the most enduring treasure Dick gave to his dogs was to greatly ease their owner's entry into the world of quality hunting retrievers. By popularizing the working abilities of water dogs and demystifying their training he enabled tens of thousands of owners and their dogs to enrich their relationship at home, in the field and on the marsh. That's a big gift.

Times change. Print has given ground to electronic information transfer, especially visual media. Dog work has really improved too. Wolters was fond of saying a '90's hunt test required work found in lational championship events just a decade earlier. Even RAW changed his attitude about training. His last big dog, Duck, never learned the 2 whistle send and was collar conditioned by a profes-

sional hunt test trainer, Richard MacDonald. GMHR RAW's DUCK SOUP has the high performance of a Ferrari. Seems Mr. Wolters was one old dog who could really learn new tricks!

So it's not surprising that the revised Wolters' bestseller, GAME DOG, became the basis for a video produced, in part, by his widow, Olive. This high quality production features Charlie Jurney, a professional trainer, hunt test competitor and ardent duck hunter. Jurney shows how to pick a suitable puppy and start him/her off in the correct manner. He explains basics in a direct, understandable, and charming way. Lessons are specific, described in simple terms, step-by-step. One suggestion, though. Keep a pencil and paper handy. You'll want to stop motion and take notes frequently. There's lots of information conveyed rapidly. The beginner will need to digest, think about and revisit the tape as his/her own training progresses.

Make no mistake. This is not a video for the advanced retriever fanatic. Collar work is not covered. Force training is only mentioned in passing and then incompletely. Also, and a little offputting, hunting scenes are obviously staged, But everyone seems to be having a good time, especially the dogs.

Here's my advice. Buy the tape before you buy the pup. Pay attention to everything, including the puppy selection part. I'd probably pick that most animated, wired puppy rather than the middle of the road animal Jurney recommends. But his advice and reasoning are good. Follow

the tape carefully and completely, omitting no steps. And seek advice from more experienced friends while you're getting started. Or join a retriever club. Remember, retriever training is a group effort, especially teaching marking concepts. By the way, this video is fairly casual about marking. Multiple marks, switching, integrating marks with blinds (six-send drills, poison bird blinds) are not addressed. These may be considered "advanced" work, but any finished hunting retriever should be able to ignore a close dead bird and be sent for a cripple across the creek.

Use the video assiduously to get pup through the basics, then decide what you need for your own hunting situations. Perhaps gun over your pup one season. The elementaries taught in the video cover 90% of hunting experiences. But if you'd like a consummately steady dog who will sit quietly outside your blind with birds in the air and who will handle reliably, despite major distractions, spend the time and money on a professional trainer at this point.

There are few how-to-videos of the genre which can take the novice from, "I wanna" to, "I own a hunting retriever" so easily and quickly. GAME DOG is among the best. Release is expected in late summer, 1995.

"Jeepers Creepers"

I always dream of having that rock of a dog. We go to the line and he sits there patiently, with just a light swing of the head as he watches the three birds fall. Then with a quietly muttered "back" he is off like a bullet to the last bird down.

Unfortunately, I own a possessed demon. Coal is his name, and like the burning rock, his heart is on fire at a trial. He dances at the line and I hold my whistle like a rosary, praying that he doesn't break.

So, I feel like a well qualified individual to discuss that hardest of all rules for my dog, control at the line and breaking. I feel that many a judge has forgiven our wild antics at the line due to his work out in the field.

The first rule to affect a dog with poor line manners, let's say my dog for example, arrives with Chapter II, Section 4: "Moderate voice or whistle commands shall be allowed to steady the dog at the point of origin. However, voice or whistle commands that are excessive, in the opinion of the judges, shall be marked down. (Repeated evidence may be grounds for elimination.)"This is generally meant to imply a few verbal commands or light whistles for sitting. A good rule of thumb is that one conversational toned "sit" per bird thrown is safe. Much more could lead you to danger. NAHRA is attempting to simulate a hunting situation. It is always difficult to call birds or hunt doves when the dog with you is practicing gymnastics. A hunter screaming "Sit...Stay...Sit...Sit" usually has their hunting potential limited by the dog's behavior affecting the ability to call and shoot birds. In hunting situations, I usually fair better than at trials. My furred demon is usually quiet until AFTER I shoot. At that time, if I miss he complains with a pitiful wailing: "Aaawwwrrr". In English this is equivalent to "Hooowww'd you misss?"

In order to continue our discussion, three rules must be brought to light. These are stated in Chapter II, Sections 20, 21 and 22. The first of these states: "The 'point of origin' is the area in which the dog is located when the first bird becomes visible in a marking test or the area designated by the judges as the starting point for the blind retrieve, trail or upland hunting test." This can be further supported by Chapter V, Section 10. This rule is discussing senior tests when simulating jump shooting: "Walk ups to stimulate jump shooting may be used in this event. The dog shall be brought to an area designated as the of origin at heel or under control within (10) feet of its handler." While this rule is applicable for Senior dogs, it is the only statement in the rule book of how far a dog can range and still be under control. Therefore, I fix my "point of origin' to be the point the judges want the handler and dog to begin and not to exceed beyond 10 feet of control.

This leads us to our next dilemma. Often at Senior tests, I see a dog hopping at the line (for Coal, the ghost of future trials to come). First bird down, dog moves 5' forward. "Sit" mumbles the handler. Second bird down, dog moves 5' forward. "Sit" mumbles the handler. Third bird, ditto. When the handler is ready to send the dog for the bird, he is already 15' to 25' away (roughly the limit of my

shooting). Chapter II, Section 22 states "Creeping should not be considered as a dog manifesting an intent to retrieve. Therefore, 'creeping' shall not be considered a break and the judges shall not instruct the handler to re-heel the dog. However, if the creeping is excessive where it takes the dog out of the area of the point of origin, then it shall be considered a controlled break and the handler shall be required to control his/her dog." We can, therefore, postulate that a dog moving on the line is ok. A dog creeping forward slightly is fine. Judges should instruct handlers as to the distance they feel is "out of the origin". I use 10' as a guide. The important judgement is whether the dog "manifests an intent to retrieve".

The final of the three rules is Chapter II, Section 21. This states "A 'Controlled break' occurs as soon as a dog leaves the point of origin and manifests an intent to make the retrieve without being so ordered and is immediately stopped and brought under control". Key here is that the dog attempts to make a retrieve. It is not hopping forward, creeping, or crawling. It is on the run-way and is taking off. Whether it hits our 10' limit or not, it's going forward with an intent. That intent is to get that bird. The difference between a Controlled break and a full break is that the dog is immediately stopped and brought under control as quickly as you can get that whistle into your mouth. By tradition, a breaking dog is re-heeled. However, the rules state that the dog is only stopped and brought under control. You could cast your dog from the point of control, but I wouldn't take the chance of discussing this with a judge after you get dropped. You may want to bring the dog back to the point of origin and then send it. Finally, there is a bone of contention here. The rules state that the dog manifests the intent to retrieve without being ordered. This means that he/she goes before the handler sends it. The problem is if the judges are not calling "dog". In this case the handler may send the dog when the last bird is down. How does a judge call a break on the final bird if they are not calling dog? Conceivably a handler can say they sent the dog on a sneeze after the bird hits. The art in interpretation here is how does the handler typically send the dog. If the word 'back' is typically used and then once the dog fires off with nothing stated, it is hard to evaluate whether the handler is using a"quiet" hand signal or if the dog broke.

With all this in mind, we can now explore how each category deals with control at the line independently. With Started control should not be an issue. The handler is allowed to restrain the dog with a lead. Woa unto ye that fail to use a lead - there is no mercy for a breaking dog in Started. Chapter III, Section 2 states "A dog is required to be steady at the point of origin; however, it may have a leash, line or slip lead around its neck and/or may be held by one hand only, to assist in achieving steadiness." Therefore, short of an Iditarod sled puller, a lead can help restrain a dog until the handler is ready. Or if you have an iron grip, one hand can be used on the dog. Note, at no other time or in no other category are you allowed to touch the dog.

NAHRA Financial Summary and Our Recommendations

This is the first of a series of recommendations we are making to NAHRA based on our meeting of 6-7 May 1995. Following is our summary of the complete financial report that we received from NAHRA. (The original is 3 pages long and was accompanied by several hours of discussion with NAHRA President, Jack Jagoda.)

NAHRA operates efficiently on a modest budget. Our review of the expenses found little room for reduction, especially since we feel that the publication of NAHRA News is an important part of our organization. If programs and services are to be maintained at present levels, improved, or expanded, we must find ways to generate additional revenue. We discussed ideas to do this and submit the following recommendations for discussion and action.

1) We recommend that individual NAHRA News subscription and dues be increased from \$25 to \$30.

2) Corporate and individual sponsorships contribute significantly to NAHRA. We thank current sponsors, encourage new individuals to take sponsor memberships, and seek your help in finding ways to increase overall participation and sponsorship. 3) We discussed ways that clubs could contribute their fair share to NAHRA without hurting new or small clubs, but postponed a recommendation until we could hear from you. We also felt that items like signs and extra rule books could be sold at cost, rather than given away by NAHRA;. Affluent clubs should consider helping immediately with club sponsorships or contributions. All clubs need to find ways to help in the future. What do you think of club dues based on club activity? Application fees? Fees for supplies?

4) In the future, NAHRA should employ a part time paid Executive Director and should also have additional staffing for NAHRA News and at peak clerical times. This was discussed, but with out reaching a specific recommendation.

We left the meeting impressed and proud of the effectiveness of the countless volunteers and many sponsors. The efficiency of the office administered by Jack Jagoda and Rosemary Haynes is obvious. NAHRA has been THE LEADER in hunting retriever testing, thanks to them and YOU the MEMBER-SHIP. In our opinion, NAHRA is worthy of your increased support.

Throughout history there have been famous people who have become legends. Their lives were flamboyant or romantic, and stories about them developed -- some fact, some fiction. The tales endured by being shared and passed down around a campfire, in a bar, or at a family gathering.

Quality Birds Make Quality Tests

by Paul Young and Ron Mandsager

We believe that all NAHRA clubs have an obligation to show participants a quality test. One of the key factors in giving a high quality NAHRA test is the condition of your birds. A starting point is to have a minimum of one live bird per dog on the grounds the day of the test. If shot flyers are used, you probably need at least 2 birds per dog.

Another important consideration is care of the birds; both live and dead. Live birds should be fed, watered and kept in the shade. When needed, they should be killed in a humane way as privately as possible. Dead birds should be dried, protected from flies and kept cool in warm weather. Severely damaged birds should be separated from those that can be used again.

One good way to care for dead birds is a drying cage. Clubs can build a screened structure where the birds can hang to cool and dry without infestation by flies. This allows you to get more use from your birds, so the cages pay for themselves in the long term. If you would like plans for a drying cage, contact Paul Young at (203) 445-6178.

Flyer marks and the Senior Upland Test require birds that can fly. At times of the year when birds are molting, this can present a challenge that clubs need to anticipate. The Burns bird launchers help to get weak flyers up in the air, but whatever your method, work with your judges to set the necessary birds aside for crucial tests.

Judges, workers and game stewards have a joint responsibility to "present" the birds in a quality way. Tests need to be designed by your judges so that the throws are clearly visible. If your only workers are small boys, long athletic throws can't be part of the judges' design unless you have "wingers." If your workers are major league pitchers, the throws can be more difficult. In this case, be sure the replacement workers can duplicate the fete. Key workers put in key locations can make the difference between a good test and a poor one.

Shot flyers can make a test that is hard to duplicate with dead birds, even when they are thrown from a winger. Used appropriately, flyers can add excitement that dogs experience in real hunting. This can produce breaking or loss of memory for other marks. The fall is a tempting diversion, even hours later when used with a blind. Used inappropriately, they can make a poor test or give the impression of just "wasting" birds. When falls are inconsistent and scent a large area, it can make the marking test hard to evaluate or even unfair to some dogs. When birds are shot

too close, they are instantly "unfit for the table." In short, flyers are not an end in themselves; they can make an excellent test or a terrible one.

Flyers are complicated tests for judge and club alike. Your gunners have to be safe proficient shooters, hitting the bird, but not shooting too soon. They need to be consistent if the area of fall is critical. Beyond a safe sound design, probably the most important factors in good shot flyer tests are the flight condition of the birds and the experience of the thrower. A good thrower puts the birds high in the air ready to fly and in the same location bird after bird. A good thrower makes the gunners job easy. Work with your judges if you and they are using a flyer. Let them know the experience level of your thrower and guns and the condition and quality of your birds. It is better to have a dead bird or winger test than to butcher an attempt at a shot flyer.

Whatever the type and source of your birds, make every effort to have them in good condition each day of your test. They should have plenty of feathers, float well, not be shot up or badly damaged, and not be "ripe" or alive with maggots. Start your test with a plentiful supply of the best birds you can afford, and work with your judges to make the best of your situation as your test progresses. The judges are in charge of the test design, but the design needs to account for your clubs' equipment and workers as well as the condition and quantity of your birds.






Chapter IV, Section 2 deals with Intermediate steadiness at the point of origin while Chapter V, Section 2 repeats for Senior dogs. These two sections are basically identical and repeat the warnings above. However, they do state an additional item; "(As soon as the dog leaves the point of origin and manifests an intent to make the retrieve without being so ordered, it must be stopped. If a dog is immediately brought under control, it shall be considered a minor infraction. Repeated evidence of this fault may be considered serious and, in the opinion of the judges, an eliminating factor)." In light of the number of series an Intermediate or Senior dog can run, one controlled break is usually marked down a point. More than one break and you may easily find yourself paying tuition as it will take you another try before you get that qualification.





A good friend is there through thick or thin and gives so much of himself that personal vacation is spent and his family forgets what he actually looks like. Long hours are spent behind the wheel of a vehicle to get "somewhere" before dark to set up tests for the next morning's start of testing.

I recently received a note from a "good friend" stating that they were going to let their NAHRA membership lapse and that they were going to move on to other things in their personal world. For the moment, they are without a dog. They have no immediate plans to have a dog and most of their not having a dog is purely circumstantial. They have no gripes with the program or with NAHRA overall. They have been active for the past twelve years and carry twelve years of judging and solid gundog experience. If it were possible, a dog would certainly be a part of their family. Crowded personal and business agendas dictate and take priority and for the moment they cannot give a dog the time and challenge that is required to maintain a versatile bunting retriever.

They have declined several invitations to judge in '95. While it was not pleasant to say "no" to someone who acknowledged their abilities enough to ask them out, they felt personally that it was the best thing under the circumstance. They are tired of being asked how they can judge if they do not in fact own a dog. Obviously, past experience and achievements in NAHRA, are no longer enough to maintain a judges' license.

I know several prominent high profile judges who have never trained their own dog and held a second job to pay for a Pro to train for them. I know of some judges who don't even run their own dogs, but have someone else stand out on the line and bring home the ribbons.

I don't "have a dog" at the moment for many reasons. I had my 3 year old put down in September '94 a couple of weeks before my hunting trip. I have an eight year old, that hasn't been "trained" in years and is simply a companion and house dog that only gets bumpers in the yard to keep her feeling like she's still a valuable asset.

So in theory, I don't have a dog. Eight years ago I had to return to work and exist on one paycheck. A wonderful dog that I was training and handling was retired leaving me no further opportunity to continue to campaign in NAHRA. I had other dogs but could not afford to travel or run in the program. To maintain my involvement with a good bunch of people, and to support a concept that I still believe in, today, I obtained my judge's license. Every season my tags are filled. Perhaps a couple of people asked me if I owned a dog and I have paid interest attention.

The NAHRA program is maturing and so are the people who were so full of conviction and vigor twelve years ago. For some, seasonal circumstance has dictated they will never be able to campaign a dog even if they owned one. Yet, they still train and hunt and still believe that NAHRA is the place to be. These "dogless" people are the first ones in line to help, should a club, a friend or "something" needs assistance and doing. The people with the dogs are always "too busy".

So the next time that you come to the line remember that the judges that are standing out in the rain and cold or heat and humidity all started out with a dog. They didn't just wake up one day and decide to

"judge". Their ongoing conviction and passion for this sport and for NAHRA, is what makes your weekend on the line so memorable, good or bad.

Our experienced forces are getting tired of being "judged out". Some are simply moving on due to fatigue. For others, their profile and lifestyle have changed with a new young dog of their own to run in the program.

We are experiencing large growth as we enter 1995 and it is going to be hard going with full weekends for the experienced judges we do have on hand. If you can do as good a job or better then call the office and obtain the judges' test, write it and pass it today. And accept those assignments that come your way, rather than say "I'd rather run my dog". NAHRA needs competent judges today more than ever. Put something back into the program that has given you and your dog so much.

So in closing, I am sad to say that NAHRA is losing another good person and the dogs are losing another experienced judge. To him, and all of the others like him, that have given so freely of themselves, I say thanks for all you've done over the years. You will be remembered.






