President's Bark by Jack Jagoda



There is a special bond between man and dog that is known only to those hunters that hunt with dogs. Like most of you, I was a hunter who felt a need for a hunting dog. I read every book I could find to help me in my search for the right pup. Based on my research, I decided a German Shorthaired pointer would be the best dog for me because of its versatility. I chose a promising male puppy from a litter that was

advertised as being from strong hunting stock, but lacking any field titles. I named by pup Buck, and Buck grew to be a fine, healthy, good looking fellow, a fine specimen of a dog. Unfortunately, either Buck's genes or my training ability failed me because Buck was not very interested in birds or hunting. Buck assumed his position as a family pet, and I again started a search for a good hunting dog. Back in those days, the major retriever breeds were more commonly thought of as waterfowl hunters. As luck would have it, my hunting interests shifted away from upland hunting toward the quest for waterfowl. I had several friends that swore by their Labs, so I decided to look in that direction. I went back to the newspapers searching for a field bred Labrador Retriever. The ads were varied and a bit confusing to a novice with all those undecipherable letters-OFA, PRA, FC, Ch. AFC. NFC. I had been advised that a purebred dog with Field Champions in a pedigree was the most desirable for a hunter. After several phone calls, a few visits, I bought a puppy and embarked on training my new hunting dog. Although this dog was not the best dog I have ever owned, he was certainly a step in the right direction. I was beginning to evolve from the hunter with a need for a dog to a dog man that hunts. Today, the selection process has been made a little easier since the advent of the Field Testing program for retrievers. Through the years, we have learned that our retriever breeds make proficient upland hunting dogs, as well as waterfowl hunters. NAHRA is the only testing program that includes upland hunting and awards titles to retrievers for their versatility since its conception in 1983.

We have come a long way since 1983 and have maintained the first comprehensive testing program for retrievers in the world. Our NAHRA members and clubs make it all possible. I *urge you*, the NAHRA membership, to assist your local clubs, to participate in events, and promote the NAHRA Field Test program. It takes a tremendous effort to maintain a retriever club and your assistance will be greatly appreciated.



springers, Hunting and NAHRA

y English Springer Spaniel "Nikki" earned her Master Hunting Retriever title in November of last year. Nikki is the second springer in the history of NAHRA and the first in the USA to earn this title. I want to thank all of the Southwest Region NAHRA members, handlers and professional trainers who have readily accepted a springer in their midst and provided valuable assistance in our pursuit of this goal.

I get many questions about training a springer for NAHRA. I initially trained Nikki strictly as a hunting dog. At the end of her second hunting season, she was 2 ½, we had severe withdrawal (no hunting, no Dallas Cowboys) and began looking for something more interesting than training. We went to an AKC spaniel hunt test and qualified both days in the Senior test. Next, we tried a NAHRA hunt test and qualified both days in the Intermediate test. The same spring we took first place in the Southern California Quail Unlimited Gun Dog Showdown. We were hooked on "dog games."

Each type of dog game presents a different challenge and training for all of these has been very interesting. Training with one group and in one location has not provided sufficient variety for us. We alternately train with field trail labs, hunt test labs, field trail & hunt test springers, hunting buddies, and by ourselves. Competing in several types of dog games is not unlike hunting several different species of birds during concurrent seasons. It is a challenge and brings out the best (and sometimes the worst) in both of us. However, it has not allowed us to specialize and master one particular event and certainly is not the approach for everyone. I try to prepare both of us a couple days before a particular event by concentrating on drills or training particular to that event. We also try to arrive at the test grounds the afternoon prior to the test. I have found we do much better if I can air Nikki on the test grounds and then find similar terrain and cover nearby where we can run drills for about 30 minutes. I have great respect for handler/dog teams that can arrive at a test the last minute and qualify. We have never been able to do that. There have been times when Nikki has been confused about what we are doing. On one memorable occasion she seemed to confuse a spaniel hunt test for a timed shoot to retrieve tournament. That was a fast paced disaster.

Training a springer for advanced retrieving requires acceptance that every dog is different and the training program must be tailored to the dog. Some trainers go through many dogs until they find a dog that fits their training method, then they are very successful with *that* dog. A springer would not do well in such a program. From my experience, I think you can train a springer about the same as you would train any other



retriever with similar characteristics. Springers are bred for quartering and flushing, training them to take fairly straight lines and to handle crisply can be time consuming and training sessions can be intensive. This is not unlike other retriever breeds that have been bred and trained primarily for hunting. Springers are quick and willing students and for the most part a joy to train.


Despite many magazine articles to the contrary, I am a firm believer that hunting tests and other dog games are for hunters and their dogs. For me, all of these are fun and beneficial to developing team work between us. Admittedly, none of these dog games can truly represent a real hunt, such as skunk, porcupine or badger encounters, falling into a hole while setting decoys, keeping a dog quiet while watching a flight of pintails work a pond, holding a dog steady on a covey break of sharptail and so on. When someone comes up with a test program that includes these things, we'll be there. I look at hunting tests as a bridge between training and hunting. Most of the mechanics, scenarios and dog control incorporated into intermediate level hunt tests are directly applicable to hunting situations.

For those of us who choose to go on to advanced levels, we are crazy anyway and must accept the rules and play the game. (Someone please remind me I said this next time I am screaming about a "stupid" test scenario.) Besides NAHRA we have run in AKC spaniel hunt tests, shoot to retrieve competition, tournament hunts, and Nikki has been the pickup dog at pigeon shoots.

What I remember most about the weekend Nikki earned her MHR title is hunting Friday morning before the test. We left our house in Orange County, CA about 4:00 a.m. and drove three hours to the Imperial Valley. A friend had scouted a location for a late season dove shoot a few miles from his ranch. We arrived in time to literally jump out of the truck and begin shooting. I did not have time to let Nikki air and stretch after the 3-hour ride. My first two shoots were at a high speed pair of mourning dove and produced a long double. Nikki, as usual in dove hunting, left when the first bird was hit. She marked the second bird while on a dead run for the first and retrieved one after the other. I never saw either bird fall, I was too busy reloading for the next shot, which came quickly. The only command I used was "drop" to release the birds to hand. Later that morning we hunted pheasants a few miles

I can still remember that dove shoot and the great team work between hunter and gun dog. I honestly cannot remember the land series the next morning when Nikki went on to qualify and earn her MHR title.

Don't get the wrong impression, Nikki and I have shed blood, sweat and tears getting to the MHR title. The ribbons and title are proudly displayed on the trophy wall and we are looking forward to the RAW Invitational. However, in looking back on the past year, my strongest memories are of hunting with friends and Nikki.



Needed: Qualified Judges

NAHRA is in constant need of new members in the judging pool. All too often, we end up seeing the same judges year after year, or even weekend after weekend during a season. Is it because these guys are nuts? Well, yes there's some truth to that. But more often it is due to the fact that clubs are forced to rely on "old faithful" to get a reliable, qualified judge who will do the work for the weekend. We are writing to urge you to get your judge's certificate through NAHRA and encourage your club to give you a judging assignment. Are you fit to be a NAHRA judge? If you're playing the NAHRA game, there is a very good chance that you are! It is our opinion that IDEAL NAHRA judges share several common traits. See how you stack up to our list - and then give it a try.

The common elements that IDEAL NAHRA Judges share are:

- 1 They are hunters. During the season, they HUNT with their dogs and know from first-hand experience what hunting retrievers do. They use this experience at tests to make realistic demands of the dogs in the design of their tests.
- 2 They know what features of tests give dogs trouble suction, terrain, wind, lighting, etc. The most obvious demonstration of this knowledge is to have trained a dog themselves through the title of the category that they are judging. Their knowledge could also come from field trial experience or close work with their dog at a pro's. The important thing is to really have the knowledge and be able to apply it to the NAHRA Standard.

"Knowing dogs" is used both to design tests and to evaluate the difficulties the dogs encounter. The real art of judging is not recording the perfect scores or outright failures, but evaluating how a dog recovers from the natural traps laid in a test. It is the evaluation of the dogs in the middle that is the difficult and the only real reason that judging is required.

- They have some empathy for the handlers. They have experienced - and remember - "failure". There are a lucky few who have gotten a once in a lifetime wonderpup who trains so easily that they rocket through the program without ever really encountering problems, disqualifications, etc. could lead to a judge who doesn't understand what it's like to be in those shoes. This individual may compare the work of the dogs being judged to his own wonderpup rather than to the NAHRA stan-With the judge who has dard. trained to title in the category he is judging, this doesn't happen too often. Judges who haven't trained and run recently, however, can sometimes view the past with rose-tinted glasses, forgetting the failures on the path to their success.
- 4 They are firm, fair, and impartial. They can evaluate the dog of a person they like or dislike with equal accuracy, knowing the dog can't help who owns him. They can stand up to a tense situation with polite resolve and work things through. Some of this experience only comes from judging, so it helps to start judging with one of those ideal judges if you can find one and are lucky enough to be paired with them at your club.
- 5 They are flexible. They can assess a difficulty and have both the flexibility to change when a test just isn't fulfilling the previous night's dream, or hunker down and watch a few weak dogs fail when the test really is sound. They can adjust to the circumstances of poor grounds, short help, or less equipment than originally desired

when needed. They come to the task with only the goal of fairly applying the Standard, not grinding an ax or demonstrating their "special" test. Many of the people who run the NAHRA game fit most, if not all of the above descriptions for at least the started category. Most will continue to learn from each test that they judge or run.

There's a perfectly selfish reason to judge a few times. Judging will give you a different perspective on the whole testing procedure. It will make you a better trainer and handler perhaps even a better sport. Many times a judge or a pair of judges will set up a test expecting some likely pitfalls only to see the field of dogs reveal different pitfalls than those which had been anticipated. The ideal judge or trainer will continue to learn.

It is only through the development and building of experienced, new, knowledgeable judges that the NAHRA program will prosper. It is imperative for all NAHRA judges to be fully knowledgable of the contents in the NAHRA Rule Book and to ensure that all participants and themselves adhere to the policies and procedures laid forth within the Rule Book. Please take stock in what you do with your dogs and why you run your retriever in the NAHRA program. If you're like many of the current NAHRA judges, you'll realize "I've benefited much from the NAHRA program. It's about time for me to give something back".

NEW Invention!

I have noticed that many field trial clubs and trainers, myself included, use a shotgun for shooting blanks for test and training purposes. However, the cost of blanks is outrageous these days. Therefore, I have invented an insert for the .410, .20 and .12 gauge shotguns so that primers can be utilized instead of blanks. The cost of the primers is minimal. This will significantly reduce the cost of using this particular training and test aid. The insert fits inside the gun's chamber and holds the primer. After the gun fires, it ejects the spent primer without removing the insert. The insert itself is easily removable when you desire to shoot live rounds. Price information available upon request.

NAHRA NORTHEAST REGION By Bo Hanson

Today while duck hunting in central Ohio, a hunting partner of mine shot and winged a drake Mallard. It flew four to five hundred yards away and landed on the other side of the lake. He, myself and "Babe: went after the duck. It was, of course, no where to be found. I put "Babe" on the bank where we saw the duck go down and told her to "find it." She began her search, and flushed it out ahead of us and out of shotgun range from a blow down in the lake. The duck could barely fly and went around a point into another small bay. We followed. searched the bay from the boat, and then started the same tactic. I put "Babe" on the bank and told her "find it" again. She searched the bank and whirled around on a dime and put her head into a muskrat hole about three feet up on the bank. She would keep returning to the hole over and over again. I told my hunting partner to go look into the hole, which was in the middle of a multi-flower rose bush. "Babe" began digging at the hole, and right in front of my hunting partner the duck came out from under the bank, via the hole, and tried to fly off. We bagged the duck this time, and "Babe" made a fine retrieve to hand.

After an hour of looking and looking, high fives and hand shakes were exchanged. My partner couldn't believe that "Babe" would not give up on the trail or on the duck. She did a great job, and without training to run the field tests, especially trailing, this bird probably would have been fox bait.

Thanks for keeping the trailing test part of the NAHRA standard and for being the original "hunters dog" club. Keep up the good work. This is what makes all of the hot summer days worth while!

May our dogs always be at our sides!■

NEW SOUTHWEST REGIONAL LIAISON!

NAHRA SOUTHWEST REGION By Jean Wu

It's an honor to be elected by my peers and mentors, to represent the SW Region, thank you for your support and confidence! I owe A LOT to the many folks (it's a very long list!) who have been along this road before me, and who have shared and encour-

aged me as a newcomer to this sport for our hunting retrievers. Even if you, like I, come into this knowing absolutely nothing, if you are dedicated to YOUR goals, take the time to really know YOUR dog and train accordingly, there is no end to what you and your dog can accomplish! NAHRA provides the best field testing program for retrievers, and will continue to do so with the support of people just like you and I!

Many of you have taken-me-under-yourwing so to speak, and know first-hand of my journey into retrieverdom! For the rest of you (count your blessings!), I will spare you ALL the details...of how I got here!

Prescott Arizona became home in 1987, when Mike and I quit being engineers for General Motors in Michigan and moved west (with aging male pet chocolate lab "Exec"), to become owner-innkeepers of the Prescott Pines Inn B&B. Welcome changes: climate ("the sun's out: another boring day in paradise!"), no more long commute to work (fall out of bed & you're there!), nice small town with clear blue skies (we had a small plane that we never had time to fly!). Distinct disadvantage (only apparent later:): no water to train dogs in; abundance of cacti and reptiles, business interferes with training: often weeks or months went by between sessions!

By late '93, after the first six years of working 27-hour days, we were able to hire managers, built our home on five acres surrounded by miles of untouched hills to hike in, and found ourselves with time (!) to pursue other interests . I'd bought Richard Wolters book "GAME DOG", just before 16 yr old 'Exec' had to be put down on New Year's Day '94 - I knew I wanted a female chocolate lab puppy to train in obedience and to try this 'hunting retriever training' I'd heard so much about. I was lucky: my sorrow was replaced with joy when we brought "Jamie" home at 7 weeks old in February. She has been my constant companion ever since and she has taught ME so much. It has been a wonderful journey so far.

NAHRA has been there the whole way: the more I read, the more I KNEW Jamie and I wanted and could do this, and I was determined to learn to train her myself. A year later we were 'hooked': she had her SR! I read more books, bought more training 'stuff", filled the freezer with more dead birds, and got a van to haul everything around in. Now all my clothes were camo and I found myself meeting all sorts of people

who also hid behind trees and threw birds and shot and felt odd without a whistle in their mouth! These people were VERY patient with me, this 'newbie' who 1) didn't hunt, 2) had never trained a retriever to hunt, and 3) insisted on doing it herself, with 4) a show-bred chocolate bitch! They showed me how to pop, how to throw, how to marshal, how to run tests and how to train when I could. Michael became quite adept at throwing and popping at tests and training (thank goodness!). Jamie was blessed with athleticism, birdiness, and total devotion to do whatever I asked.

We definitely had "NAHRA fever": the coveted WR was ours the same year she earned her SR ('95); and before Jamie was 3, she had earned her MHR (and CDX obedience title), and in '97 she got her UD obedience title), and almost has her GMHR (!) even though we are now back running the Inn again. We've even gotten to go on real upland hunts where she did outstanding on wild birds!

Along the way, it didn't take me long to realize that it was a bunch of dedicated folks, volunteering their time and expertise, who were the backbone of NAHRA. My chance to help out others as I'd been helped came when Quail West HRC moved from Parker to Cottonwood AZ: and I became the FT Secretary and FT Chairperson at several tests. Last year Quail West and Valley of the Sun HRC merged and became Copper State HRC: the merger was a challenge met by a dedicated group from both former clubs, and is an example of what can be accomplished when everyone pulls together.

Judging assignments followed, though I have to admit I would always rather run Jamie, than judge. Maybe that's because I only have one dog and don't have the chance to run her as much as I'd like, and often its MONTHS between training sessions due to running our business day to day. She has taught me to take it all in stride, to not worry about the small things (you do what you can with what you have!), and to appreciate every moment with her, every day - their time with us is so short. When I do judge, I love to do Started: it's as if I was there in those boots only yesterday, wondering if today my dog could do it! I'm always cheering for the dog, and wanting to help the handler be a bit less nervous, knowing what it feels like to stand there, alone, and hope that you don't forget everything (like your dog's name) at the wrong time!

I believe NAHRA's strength and future lies in its Started and Intermediate programs. It's so easy to become disenchanted and succumb to the pressure at the Senior level (besides, EVERYONE is an expert there!)...but Started is such fun for everyone and the dogs!

If I could have a wish, I'd like to see the SW Region expand with a NAHRA club in NV, NM, and UT. I'd like the region to support its own by helping to fund the yearly Regional event with moneys collected from all clubs throughout the year, so it is not just the host club with the financial burden of putting on this showcase event! And of course, I'd like each of the existing clubs in the region to continue to host the fine tests and special club events they already do, and to encourage rapport between the clubs, and the clubs and NAHRA.

I look forward to seeing all of our friends, and to making many new ones in '98. Again, thank you for the honor of representing all of you, and I will do my utmost to keep NAHRA the best program there is for our hunting retrievers, with YOUR input and suggestions always welcome! NAHRA NORTHWEST REGION By Phil Oldale



The test year had two major highlights. Firstly, on Memorial Day weekend, the Canadian clubs co-sponsored a very successful Regional and two day test in Lethbridge, AB. This test was very well attended and according to the feedback it generated some additional early season enthusiasm which ultimately resulted in higher than expected entries for the remainder of the year. For me, the second highlight was to take in a test at Puget Sound in the far northwest corner of our region. The grounds, weather and especially the people were GREAT. On arrival Friday evening, you were treated to oysters Rockerfeller and oysters on the half shell, plus other smoked fish dishes. Both mornings a full breakfast was created on outdoor stoves. 

It's Cold! Does More Food Keep Fido Warm?

n many parts of our country, winter brings bitter, bonechilling cold. Many of our four-legged companions are content to ride out such weather curled comfortably in a favorite chair. But not your dog. He's happiest spending these blustery days sledding with the kids or walking in the woods with you. "Some dogs-sled dogs, for example, and dogs in rural areas -are accustomed to being outdoors and are actually uncomfortable in a heated home," says Francis Kallfeltz, DVM, PhD, professor of veterinary nutrition at the Cornell University College of Veterinary Medicine.

Does Cold Make Him Hungry?

Remember how ravenous we get when we've been out in the cold for any length of time? Caring dog owners might ask if the same applies to their canine companions. Should an outdoor dog, or even one who spends just a few hours a day in the cold, be given more or richer food when he is exposed to such extreme weather? Yes, if the dog is competing in the Iditarod. the grueling 1,100-mile race in which sled dogs must survive temperatures well below zero and winds that can bring the chill factor to -50° or lower. Years ago, Iditarod dogs raced on a diet of fish stew supplemented with commercial dog food, rice, and honey. But owners of these animals have

since learned that the dogs perform better on a premium, high-protein, high-calorie diet designed just for their needs.

Increased Caloric Need

But most outdoor dogs live in considerably milder climates and have far less strenuous routines. Even they, however, may need some extra calories. Such animals can usually survive winter weather nicely on a diet of normal dry food if allowed to eat as much as they want to satisfy their seasonally increased caloric needs.

Today's nutritionally balanced dog foods will also satisfy the fat requirements of most outdoor dogs, says Dr. Kallfelz. A generic dog food that is exceptionally low in fat, however may not meet all of his cold-weather energy needs.

If you think that your dog would benefit from a winter diet that is higher in fat, it's easy enough to find a food with a higher fat content. But remember to increase the amount of fat in your dog's diet gradually, says Dr. Kallfelz. A sudden change from a food that contains six percent fat to one with 26 percent is almost certain to result in digestive upset.

Ordinary? Maybe—Maybe Not!

t all started with a desire to hunt the ducks on the Great Plains. I have long heard of this great vastness, the duck hatchery of North America. I decided to network with some friends of mine I have met through NAHRA to determine where and when I should go if the opportunity ever came available. The persistent theme which seemed to surface with each conversation centered around the ability of NAHRA dogs to perform very well, in fact, better than most guides have seen. It was indeed this theme which really drove me to schedule a hunt in North Dakota in October of 1997. I really wanted to see how my dog compared. Maybe this was selfish, I don't know. I also wanted to put NAHRA to the test. Did they offer a program which prepared me and my canine friend for the Great Plains? Time would tell.

Another reason for hunting the plains was to acclimate my dog to air travel. I was concerned as this was his first air trip and I wanted to see how he was affected. Rumor had it dogs were aggravated by baggage crews and I wanted to see if this was true and if so, how would my dog react? Another question I had was would he be able to perform the same day he traveled? We would be traveling to California for the RAW Invitational in may of 1998 and I did not want to wait and find out my answers on that trip.

NAHRA dogs should be good retrievers as well as upland hunters. Therefore, a combination hunt for waterfowl and upland birds was chosen. My wife, Colleen has hunted with me this past year and wanted to experience the excitement of this trip as well. After much searching, a hunt was booked with the Mertz family at Sheyenne Lodge, Goodrich, North Dakota. This was a family-owned business and their webpage as well as conversations I had with them made me feel at home right away. Plans were made to go the first week in October.

Flying with a dog can be burden-

some if you do not take the proper precautions. Standard procedure would have you book your flight a couple of months ahead with the airline aware of you traveling with a large dog. Remember, they have to be booked as well! you will be charged a one way fee for your dog. Our cost for this was \$50. Most airlines will not let you see your dog if you have a layover unless you re-

quest it beforehand. Otherwise your dog may be sitting in their crate for a few hours deciding what he/she should do about the increasing pressure in their bladder. Realizing how uncomfortable this is for me, we made arrangements to air the dog at our layover in Minneapolis/St. Paul.

Another concern I had flying with a dog was making sure he had

been loaded on my flight. As he was primary reason for going, I wanted to make sure he was on board! The airline was very helpful with this. A duplicate form was filled out with my plane number and destination which was attached to his crate. A carbon of this form was always brought to me on each plane when he was loaded by the crew. This was a very good way to let me know he was on board and gave me a lot of comfort. I had the chance of seeing him loaded several times and at no time did I witness any aggression by the baggage crew. They were careful and really made sure he was kept safe and out of any bad weather. He was always loaded last and unloaded first to prevent problems on the tarmat. Again, I was impressed.

Flying to North Dakota, I was awed by the amount of water which we were seeing by air. There were potholes everywhere! Every two or three hundred yards was a pond from 1/2 acre to five or six acres in size.

The average depth was two feet with the deepest still accessible with chest waders. Another observation was the absence of trees and how flat this land really was. A little roll was here and there but most of it seemed to go on forever.

As we unloaded the plane and acquired our luggage including "Bailey", my Lab, we were met by Orlin Mertz, the Patriarch of the Mertz family. We

quickly loaded our belongings in his truck and were off for our destination, about eighty miles northeast of Bismark. Orlin began to explain our hunt to us and the things we would need to know prior to our arrival. I was amazed by the fields of barley and sunflowers. No wonder they had birds. Food and water: a good combina-

tion for waterfowl. Add to this very little hunting pressure and you have an ideal spot. I think during our whole trip, we did not pass more than a handful of cars after we left the capital. To say the state was sparsely populated was an understatement.

We arrived at the lodge in ninety minutes and were greeted with "Do you want to go out on a hunt this afternoon?" What music to a waterfowler's ears. What kind of question was that? We were ready in twenty minutes. Well maybe thirty. Anyway, I was going to find out if there were any ducks in North Dakota and on top of that, if my dog was ready to hunt just after flying. He seemed to have traveled well and was no worse for the wear.

Fifteen minutes of travel and we were in a blind beside an average size pothole with decoys and shells. Our guide, Ted Mertz, Orlin's son, set out the spread and advised us of legal shooting time and when he would return. He would not hunt or stay with us unless we requested it. That was fine with me as he



was going to scout for geese for our morning hunt. Anyway, I wanted to HUNT! I wanted to call and have my dog work. That was why I came.

Quickly the ducks came. Singles and pairs: teal, widgeons, shovelers, mallards, gadwalls, they all came. WOW!!! We were busy and so was "Bailey." He was ready to work and showed no jetlag. One question answered. Now my real purpose in coming was just around the corner. How does he measure up and just how good is a NAHRA dog? Knowing in my own experience NAHRA dogs perform well, I needed to see if I had lived a sheltered life. Could they stand up across the country to other dogs? Tomorrow would tell.

Back at the lodge, we were met by our other guides and assigned a hunt for the morning. To say we had a nice dinner would be a misnomer. We had a GREAT meal!! Fresh sandhill crane for an appetizer with cheeses and breads for starters. Then a nice juicy steak cooked to your preference with lots of fresh vegetable, salad and desert. I could already see I needed to walk a few hundred miles upland hunting to keep from gaining weight during our stay. We met other hunters and made final preparations and then went to bed. By the way, they allowed me the choice of kenneling my dog or allowing him to stay inside with us. "Bailey, what would you like to do?" you know the answer!

RRINNGGG! Oh my! It is o'dark-thirty. Five AM and time to get moving. I am a little nervous and excited at the same time. Kinda like the first time I kissed my wife. Oh well, I shall not talk about that. A quick cup of coffee for me and a cup of tea for my wife. Sweet rolls, fruit, and toast were available. "Bailey" and his regular chow. Colleen was excited as it was a tolerable temperature. For me and the rest of us it was a little hot, about 45 degrees Fahrenheit.

Out to the fields we trudged. Decoys were placed and our hunt was on. Today I would see if "Bailey" could run with the big dogs. Today I would get my answer.

NAHRA was good or well, you know, evil. we took several ducks quickly as the morning sun blazed the horizon. Geese came AND went about their merry way. Not as good of a hunt as I would have liked but fun anyway. I still did not have my answer. The retrieves "Bailey" made were easy and we did not really have an outstanding morning.

While the guides were busy cleaning our birds, we were changing our clothes for upland hunting. This was my first chance on the plains. After a nice brunch, we took off in search of sharptails and huns. We brought along a German Shorthair as well as "Bailey." This was what I had

been waiting for. I really wanted to know if we had prepared to walk the Plains. We walked and walked. I was beginning to appreciate my dinner last night when one of our party stumbled on some sharptails. He was separated from us about two hundred yards. His dog was walking behind my dog and lucky for him, he just stepped on them. The report of his gun startled me and I saw one bird fall. His dog ran over to find the bird and only to fail. "Bailey" continued to hunt and finally we were able to put up birds and shoot a few sharptails. It was hot and after a few hours we decided to call it quits to get ready for an afternoon of duck hunting.

Colleen and I were taken to a small pothole about 1/2 miles from another hunting party. We had "Bailey." They had chest waders. That afternoon we limited out on a smorgasbord of ducks. The other party had trouble finding their ducks and spent a great deal of time looking for them, time they could have been shooting. Now I was getting my answers. "Bailey" did his work and did it well. I

could spend time shooting instead of walking the marsh looking for birds. He also found the birds for the other party, all of them! They had marked each bird downed with an empty shot casing. I have usually found most hunters were not very good at this but these guys were surprisingly accurate. Sounded like they had a lot of practice. They would tell me where the bird was and sometimes I could see it on the water. "Bailey" and I had a super time performing blind retrieves and after picking up the last bird, I heard a round of applause. I turned and found all of our hunting party watching and clapping for our performance. What was ordinary to me was not ordinary to their hunting society.

Back at the lodge, I was bombarded with questions of training and handling. Our guides came up and stated they really enjoyed watching "Bailey" work and of course you know who was enjoying every minute of it. It was hard to get my head in the shower that night from

WOW! You just picked out that new pup from the hundreds of pedigrees, and phone conversations with breeders. Now what? Well, let's look at our expectations for this new puppy. Everybody that runs NAHRA events should set his or her goals for the best possible hunting retriever. If we work hard and put in a small amount of time a Grand Master Hunting Retriever is very possible. But where do we start?

Starting a new puppy is a great time and rewarding experience that only requires one rule... Puppy must always have fun! All of the lessons we will attempt to teach at this time revolve around this new puppy having fun. I know that you will sometimes get very upset with this new Grand Master, but at this young age they cannot learn if it is not fun.

Now that we all know that this new puppy must always enjoy learning, how can we teach the commands? We cannot possibly cover all the training examples with solutions. This will help you think of a solution and give you ideas on how to handle problems that you may encounter along the way.

At seven weeks of age, you new GMHR has probably not developed many bad habits, however, he also has not developed a lot of good habits. Lets always work at developing good habits. We all want our new puppy to be a retrieving fool, so lets get the puppy to retriever as early as possible. Some puppies enjoy

retrieving some things more than others, so let the puppy retrieve what he enjoys at this age. Some puppies will like certain objects more than others. Remember our first rule? Let puppy retrieve whatever makes him happy. At this stage, it is not important as so what he is retrieving as to that he is retrieving.

We can also start to teach some easy commands at this age. If you feed the puppy in the kennel or crate, say kennel every time and gently put him in. The puppy will very quickly learn that as soon as he runs into the kennel, he can eat. This will lead to just saying the work kennel and the puppy running in because you have developed a good habit. The new puppy has just learned his first real command with no pressure and while he was having fun.

At this age we are teaching our puppy to learn. Using the puppy's knowledge of retrieving and kenneling, he is ready for our next command. We can start to have puppy sit on command. Using a leash, gently pull up on the leash, and push the butt down saying "sit." Them throw his favorite object to retrieve, releasing the puppy as soon as an attempt is made to retrieve. Do not worry yet about promoting steadiness. We want to see puppy crazy to retrieve and be willing to sit to get you to throw something. You will be surprised how fast they learn to sit on command as long as you are willing to throw something in return. Once your puppy is running into the kennel to be fed, you can start to use your sit command prior to putting the food down. Pup will learn the faster he sits, the faster he can eat.

You have started to teach the puppy by using things that the puppy like to do. The first few months should be filled with lessons that your new puppy can learn while he is having fun. Don't push faster than the puppy is capable of learning. This is not a race to see how fast you can put a title on your puppy. At this stage of your puppy's development, always remember rule number one...puppy must always have fun!




